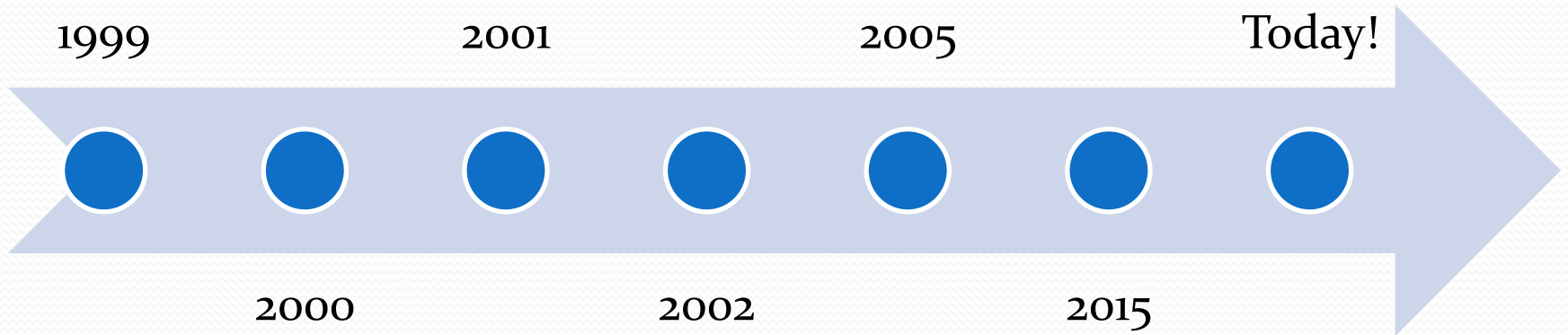

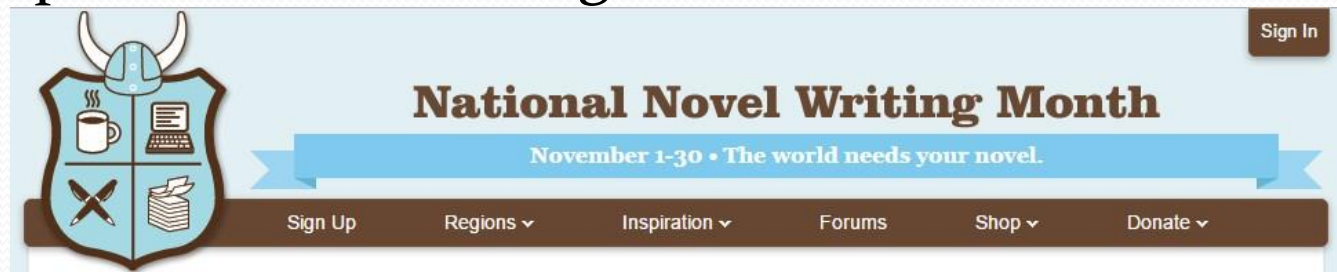

How do you do NaNoWriMo?

- Sign up at NaNoWriMo.org



- Home to USA::Michigan::Lansing
- Sign Up to Receive our Regional Emails so you can stay in the loop
- Introduce yourself on our introduction thread
- Come to our Kick Off on October 30 from 2-5 pm at the Avenue Cafe and RSVP tonight.
- Commit yourself to writing 50,000 words in November.

How do you do NaNoWriMo? (Part 2)

- ~1667 words a day
- To be legit, these should be all new words.
- Traditionally wrimos write a novel in November, but you can be a rebel and write non-fiction.
- Come to write ins for support, encouragement and cauldron of doom word wars that are sure to increase your word count.
- Upload your novel into the validator starting November 21st to prove your wrote 50,000 words.
